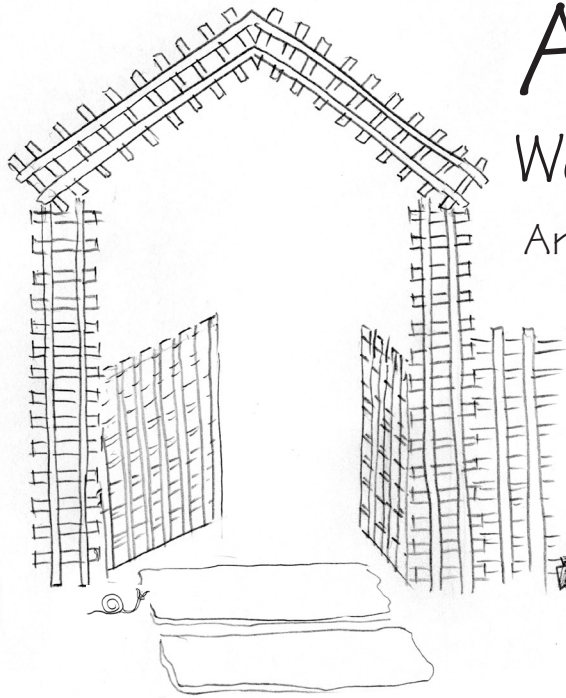


A Kid's Guide

Welcome to Anne Spencer's Garden

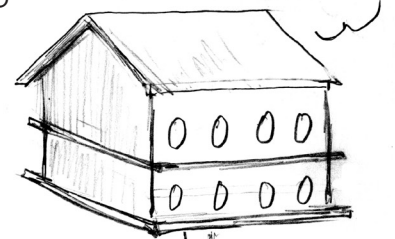
Anne's husband, Edward, built the garden for her.

He could talk!



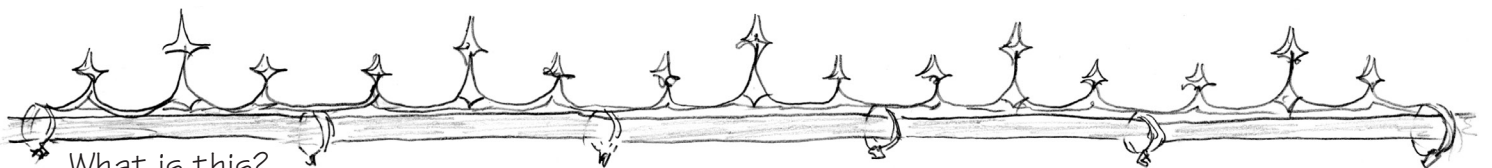
There are three of

Birdbath



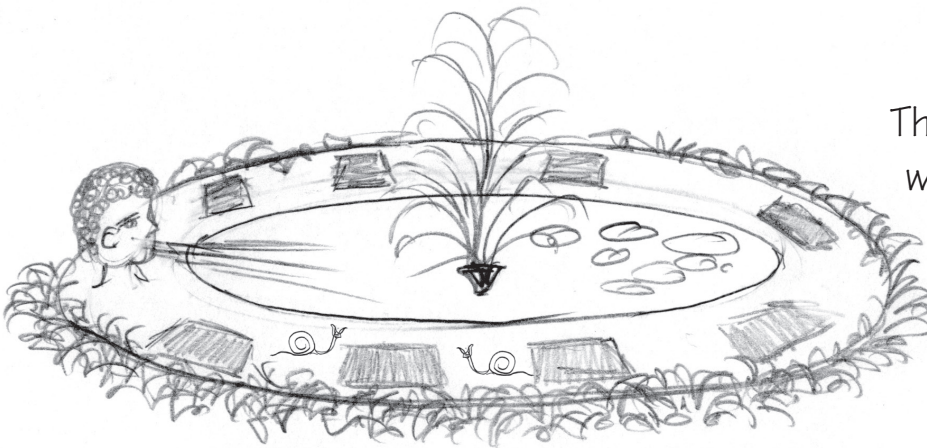
What is this?
